- 8. The first target age group will be those between the ages of 15 and 35, with emphasis placed on marginalized groups, women, girls, SC/ST/OBC/Minorities, and PWDs. Geographically speaking, focus will be on aspirational districts, places with literacy rates below the state or national average, and places where, according to the 2011 Census, the percentage of women literate is less than 60%.

- 10. ULLAS, positioned as Janandolan under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, aims for broad participation, involving millions of students, teachers, volunteers, and support from various entities. Media platforms, including electronic, print, folk, and social media, will be utilized for outreach.
- 11. Literacy assessments will occur in local schools, capturing real-life learning and skills through a scientific format. There will be on-demand exams via OTLAS and e-certificates that are jointly endorsed by NLMA and NIOS.
- 12. An Annual Achievement Survey of Learning Outcomes and an Outcome-Output Monitoring Framework will be implemented, sampling 500-1000 learners from each state/UT.
